Workshop Description

Actions figures aren't just for the eclectic nerd of the avid collector but an item that people admire or look upon with fond memories of past, or current events. While most collect to commemorate a favorite tv show, comic book, movies, or story; some collect because they relate to a specific character.

This workshop is designed to vanquish the notion that action figures are for a certain type of person, as well as express who you are as an individual in a tiny format.

Through the use of common materials such as air dry clay and acrylic paints, students will be asked to create a small rendition of themselves that represents who they are. It can look realistic or be modeled to look any way the student feels, as long as it's something that represents who they are as a person.

Jessica Fennessey is a visual artist with a concentration in ceramics, digital design, photography, and being a geek. Fennessey graduated from Florida Atlantic University with a BA in Fine Arts and is currently pursuing her MFA in Visual Arts at Jacksonville University. Through these miniature inhabitants, she allows the audience to generate the backstory and characters personality using hints placed around the character.
